Grant Proposal Tips

- Register and Submit Early
- Thoroughly read and follow all of the instructions provided by the agency
- Include Sufficient Program and Budget Details
- Strongly recommend filling out optional forms in the app package

Grants.gov Application Tips

- Limit Application File Size/ File Name Characters (50 or less)
- Avoid Special Characters in File Names (\$, %, &, *, etc.)
- Use Correct DUNS Number in the SF-424 Cover Page
- Make sure you have Grants.gov compatible software
